

English test sample

1. In Section 1 of the test you will need to choose only one answer out of 3 or 4 options. If you don't want to guess, please choose "I don't know.' This is a placement test so it's best to avoid guessing.

Example:

There are still _____ citizens who feel unhappy about the changes made by the government.

- a. a little of
- b. quite many
- c. quite a few
- d. a great deal
- e. I don't know

(The correct answer is: c. quite a few.)

2. In Section 2 you need to think of a word (only one word) which best fills the gaps in the text. Sometimes more than one answer is possible, but it is always a single word.

Example:

Visitors can expect to pay about _____ thousand pounds a day.

(The correct options could be either 'a 'or 'one '.)

3. In Section 3, you get a gapped text describing accompanying graphs. You need to choose the best option for the gap. All options are grammatically possible but only one is adequate in this context.

Example:

The table _____ average disposable income in three different countries in 2017.

- a. presents
- b. shows us
- c. gives you

(All answers are grammatically possible but answer A is preferred stylistically.)

4. In Section 4 you need to choose all the correct options out of a choice of four. The more correct answers you are able to identify, the higher will be your score. The number of correct options varies from one to three.

Example:

___ not ideal, this attitude is not entirely destructive.

- a. Although
- b. Even though
- c. However
- d. Albeit

(The correct answers are a), b) and d). If you choose only one, you will get only one point. If you choose all three, you will get three points.)
